The Knowledge Commons at the Marriott Library is the largest computer lab on the University of Utah campus. With over 250 computers and 23 study rooms, it is an incredible facility for students.



With computers, printers, VCR's, classrooms, and consultant help, the Knowledge Commons C is your one stop multi-media resource.

What Can I do at the Knowledge Commons?

- Use Computers to write papers, do homework, research, etc...
- Print computer documents
- Listen to audio tapes and CDs, watch videos.
- Take computer short classes.
- Send and receive e-mail.
- Access library -owned databases, electronic journals and indexes.
- Browse the internet for serious research or fun.

AUDIO-VISUAL RESOURCES

The Knowledge Commons features an extensive collection of over 15,000 films, including DVDs, and 5,000 audio CDs which are available to be used by students in the Knowledge Commons. The films range from the latest PBS specials and History Channel features to horror, comedy, science-fiction, classics, and drama titles. There is also CD-ROM software and computer books that are available for checkout.

COMPUTING

With over 250 PCs, Macs, and Linux machines in the Knowledge Commons, students have a wide variety of options for computer use. We support all of the Microsoft Office programs, web design software such as Dreamweaver and Flash, art programs such as Photoshop and Illustrator, along with video editing titles like iMovie and Final Cut Pro. There are desktop publishing applications such as InDesign and Publisher, sound editing software, 3D graphics programs, and a wide variety of utilities and other



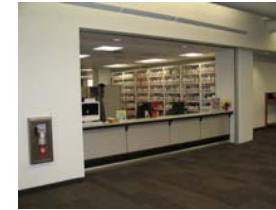

Safari, and many more web browsers are available for surfing the Internet along with full access to all of the University's websites for schedules and grades.

PRINTING

The Knowledge Commons has several printers, including color laser printers, available for student use. All of our computers are able
